Nets; fishing, large and small, and butterfly  
Kennels of all sizes  
Towels, sheets, receiving blankets, fleece and flannel blankets  
Paper towels, tissues, dish soap, bleach, non-scented laundry soap  
Latex (or other disposable) gloves  
Garbage bags  
Scrub brushes  
Unused medical supplies: syringes, esp. insulin needles  
Pet baby bottles with nipples, regular baby bottles  
Cloth cages, pet tents  
Plastic tubs  
Ceramic or stainless steel dishes  
Disposable food storage containers, esp. small sizes  
Face shields, as for welding, safety glasses  
BBQ gloves, or Welding gloves  
Heat lamps, or ceramic heaters for reptiles, full-spectrum reptile UVA/UVB lights  
Terrariums or aquariums  
Heating pads, Snugglesafe® heat pads, Hot water bottles  
Trouble lights  
Feather dusters or feather boas (foster duck “moms”)  
Non-clumping litter  
Litter boxes  
Children’s Wading pools  
Large watering troughs  
Building materials for pens: wood, fencing, screen, mosquito netting

Gift certificates to grocery and hardware stores  
Bedding; shavings, straw, leaves  
Astroturf mats  
Live and fake non-toxic trees, shrubs, greenery  
Coroplast sheets  
Small refrigerators and freezers in working condition  
water pumps  
Shorter pieces (2-3 ft) of plastic culverts  
Pedialite, unflavored
