COURSE OFFERINGS

Basic Wildlife Rehabilitation

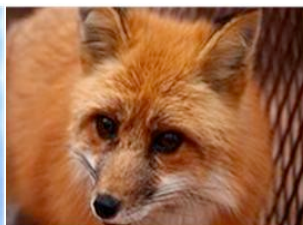
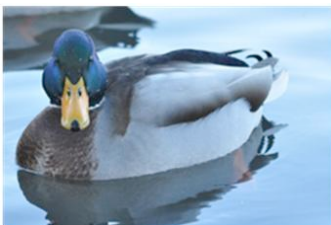
An introductory course that includes: intro to rehab, anatomy and physiology, calculating drug dosages, handling, physical restraint, thermoregulation, initial care and physical examination, nutrition, housing standards, zoonoses, euthanasia and release . Includes a half-day lab to practice techniques. (Full course earns 13 CEUs)

Advanced Feeding and Nutrition

Feeding and Nutrition addresses the nutritional requirements of mammals and birds with principles applicable to reptiles and amphibians. Lecture topics include: basic nutritional biochemistry, gastrointestinal physiology and anatomy, neonates, self-feeding process, natural diets, nutritional requirements, feeding ill and emaciated animals, analyzing and formulating diets, minimizing captive stress through feeding and foraging enrichment.

Parasitology

Covers individual parasites, their life cycles, and their transmission to new hosts. Learn to identify the diagnostic forms, treatments to use and also the zoonotic potential for many varieties of parasites.
